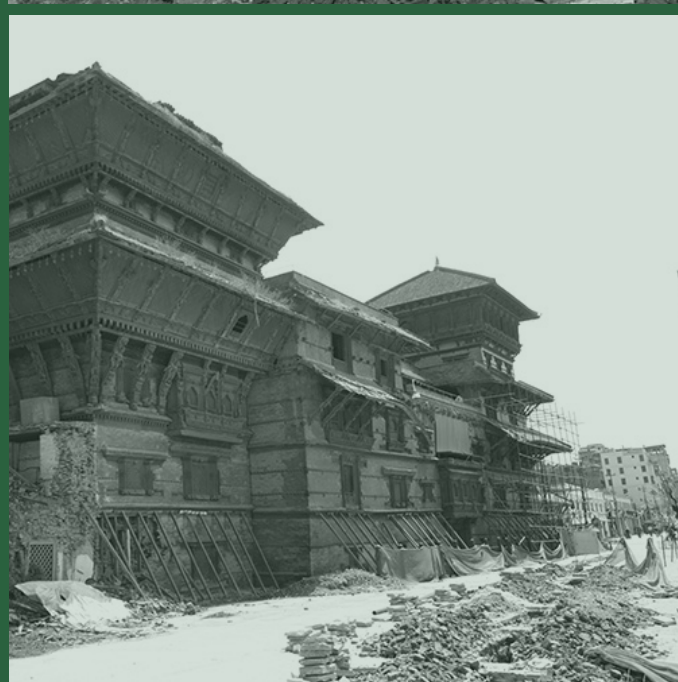

- Current Issues (II): Post-Disaster Recovery and Resilience-Building Case Studies -

In the Asia-Pacific region, disasters such as floods, landslides, typhoons/cyclones, earthquakes, tsunamis, storm surges, and volcanic eruptions occur every year. How to protect cultural heritage from these disasters is a common issue for all countries throughout the region.

The International Symposium is a three-year project which promotes the sharing of experience, expertise, and case studies on the issues created by natural disasters in the Asia-Pacific countries, and aims to discuss the ways of minimising the damage to cultural heritage by undertaking measures on an everyday basis. Last year, the workshop focused on the case studies of emergency response. This year, we would like to address the issues of post-disaster recovery. In the third, concluding workshop, we will summarise the opinions expressed in the previous years and discuss the methods of effective disaster mitigation.

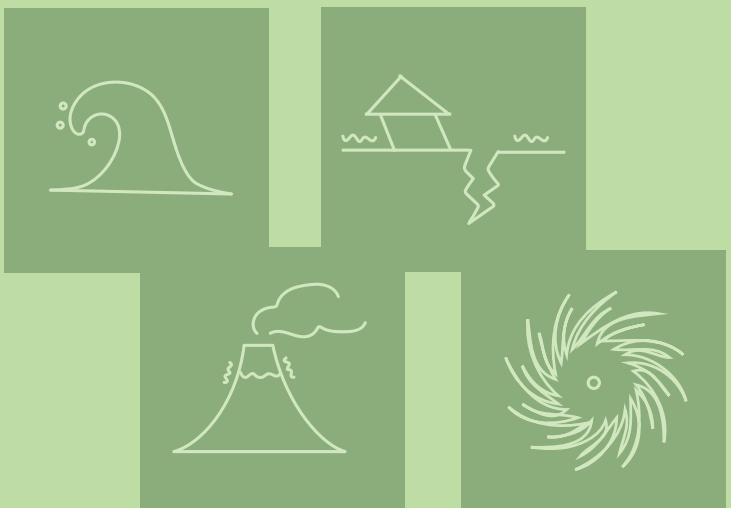
